# East Pennine Orienteering Club Summary of Committee Meeting Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> January 2018 at 7pm Marsh Liberal Club



- 1. Present: Jean Lochhead, Rod Shaw, Jackie Page, Neil Croasdell, Davey Averill, Emma Harrison, Viv Barraclough, Peter Brooke (British Orienteering Development officer)
- 2. Apologies: none
- 3. Date of Next meeting: 14<sup>th</sup> March, plus an additional meeting on 7<sup>th</sup> Feb to discuss development grant application. Peter Brooke spoke about suggestions for a grant application for a training SI kit, some Xplorer/level D events and club nights/coaching based on successful applications for similar by other clubs. Jean stated that permanent courses are important for EPOC's outreach. Agreed that another meeting was needed to discuss a strategy as the agenda was rather full.
- 4. Minutes of previous meeting on 8.11.17: Minutes agreed as correct
- 5. Treasurer's Report: David had circulated this prior to the meeting. Successful event at Ogden. Maps left over which Jean would like to use for a fell-runner's event; midweek points system simple event. David suggested Junior squad might use them otherwise. Went through list of members yet to renew; various committee members to chase up. SIAC will be needed for the UK UL event in July. Our boxes are ok but if there is an event where both systems are used need to have an extra box for starting and finishing so that people who are doing results can see the times separately. Competitors need to dib start and finish as need to know whether they've finished for safety.

# Forest Challenge!

# The orienteering board game for 2-6 players from North Gloucestershire Orienteering Club



- √ The game includes everything you need laminated map, kites, punch cards, "Control" cards,
  "Advantage" cards, instructions, dice, tokens etc.;
- Design a different course each time you play by using the moveable control stickers;
- ✓ The map sections can be fitted together in different combinations for more variety;
- ✓ Choose score or line orienteering;
- ✓ Add even more variety by drawing your favourite terrain on the blank map grids supplied.

General idea of the game. Each player takes it in turn to throw the dice and move his token between controls, choosing his own route as in real orienteering. On reaching a control a player takes a Control card and follows its instructions. During the game players can use their Advantage cards in conjunction with their dice throw to help them get ahead of, or catch up, other players. The winner is the first player to reach the finish line. The use of moveable control stickers means that you can run a different course every game!

# **Orienteering in Madeira**

Around June last year I noticed a single page website for a 4 day event in Madeira in the last week of January. I contacted them to confirm the dates so I could book the flights whilst prices were still cheap. They confirmed, we booked. Website never updated but in October I came across an advert for Orienteering Festival in Madeira but a week earlier than our flights. I contacted the organiser and confirmed that there were 2 meetings on the island in consecutive weeks, so we contacted Easyjet and for £35 got our outward flight date changed.

The first meet consisted of a night urban event in Santa Cruz and two in the mountains – as first start time for night race was 8pm we decided to book into a hotel in Santa Cruz that night. Wonderful choice - the registration/finish was just across the road from the hotel with the start some 20 yards around the corner. Because it was an urban event we'd only taken hand torches, just to see the map, rather than headlamps and I found some of the alleys were unlit so used the torch to see where I was putting my feet but then lost where I was on the map.

The two forest events were high up in the mountains and it was quite hairy driving up to them. I'd a nightmare run on day 3 just running out of steam and was out over 2 hours.

As the organising club were offering transport to the 4 days of the second week we decided to stay in Funchal and use that. Again the first event was an 8pm start night event this time in Porto da Cruz – at 8pm it was pouring down so the start was postponed by 20 mins – Judith had a good clean run and finished first whilst I mis-punched, my 4<sup>th</sup> control should have been 125 but I punched 123 but didn't realise it until I'd downloaded.

Next day it was up in the mountains at Fanal and we were getting near and the clag was down to about 50 yards and chucking it down – there were two mini-busses and the two drivers conferred and decided to head off to a lonely café where we all had a coffee. Just before the first start at 11am the fog lifted and the rain stopped but the wind started up and the control descriptions were disappearing like confetti at a wedding with the start official chasing after them. I was OK to No 4 then decided to go straight to 5 – big mistake, the route was through horrible gorse and brambles and I managed to slash my finger with blood pouring onto my map. When I got to 6 I needed to turn the map over but the other side was completely covered in blood which had been dried by the wind and I couldn't see the control circles so rather disgustingly had to lick off the blood so I could read it. Rest of route OK until 11 where again I encountered some man-eating brambles. As soon as I downloaded the bloke in charge shouted for first aid as I'd blood pouring down both arms. They eventually patched me up and some kindly soul went and washed my map for me. The driver then took us to Porto Moniz, famous for its natural rock bathing pools, for a couple of hours where it was hot and sunny.

The late afternoon event was a sprint round Sao Vincente – only 1.5km with 21 controls so they were very close together, however there were stacks more controls out there on similar features so we had to be a bit careful and check the control numbers.

The following day's event was an Urban event in Machico in the afternoon. The town was very quiet for a Saturday afternoon with very little traffic. The middle section of our course was very hilly and I had to walk the last section from 8 to 9. Made a real mess of 12 – didn't read the description properly (steps) coming down a narrow lane couldn't see a kite but got to some steps, assumed it would be down them and like an idiot went down, nothing there. Back up further along the lane it was there at the top of some steps leading into a building!! That cost me over 2 minutes.


The last day should have been high up on the Bica da Cana but as we waited for transport we could see the clouds completely shrouding the mountains but we set off then after about 20 minutes our driver got a phone call – the controller was up at the start where the fog was down to just a few yards and the rain coming down so he decided it was too dangerous to start as on the



So the two drivers offered to show us something of the island and took us to the second highest sea cliffs in Europe where there were some spectacular views. We then heard the prizegiving was being moved from the event centre down to Ponto do Sol where Judith got her reward for first W70.


Sao Vincente Sprint


