Ian Couch spoke about contactless SIAC cards and the implications for EPOC, particularly regarding the setting up of events. The key points are:
- Sport Ident recommend having a battery test box near registration for the SIAC cards



Schools Orienteering Competition

This year, for the first time, Orienteering is included in the West Yorkshire Winter School Games which is held every March at Beckett Park, Leeds. Schools from all over the county compete in a number of sports to determine the county champions.

As part of the qualification process for the Winter Games a competition was held at Newsome High School to select the school teams to represent Kirklees. Similar competitions have also been held in Leeds, Bradford, Calderdale (in Saville Park, Halifax) and Wakefield (St John's Primary in Normanton).

The race format of a Star Relay involved teams of 4 racing as 2 pairs. The pairs run alternate legs to collect 12 controls one at a time. This format means the changeover area is constantly busy with pairs coming in and going out and this helps to keep up the excitement. It also means small areas such as school fields can be used to produce a race of 20-40 minutes. Although complicated to explain, once the teams had started they were (nearly) all able to complete the race without mistakes.

A good number of schools have attended the district qualification rounds with close competition in all races. The top 4 teams progress on to the finals which will be held on Tuesday 27th March at Beckett Park where our first West Yorkshire County Champions will be crowned.

PS. A big thank you to those members of EPOC who helped me stage the Wakefield and Kirklees races.





INTERLAND 2018

Interland is an annual competition between England, 2 Belgian Teams (French & Flemish), The Netherlands and Northern France with runners in each age group of M/W 14, 17, 20, Open, 40, 50, 60. As the older age groups are in 10 year bands it is English policy to run at least one from the older 5 year age class, i.e. 45, 55, 65. This year I was a W45 reserve but was fortunate to be called up to run on the team.


Most of the team met on Friday 9th March for the coach and ferry journey to Holland where the competition was being held (some team members had chosen to fly separately). We had an overnight stay at Oostduinkerke in Belgium on Friday night. On Saturday morning we were up bright and early to drive to Breda in Holland where the team had time for some sightseeing, shopping, or just to have coffee and cake! Following this we carried on to the event centre at Herperduin near the town of Oss. This year the event centre for the events and the accommodation were all co-located so once we arrived in the early afternoon we could find our accommodation before heading to the start of the middle distance event. Most of the England team used this as training to get an idea of the map and terrain. I set off steadily but managed to make 3 very silly mistakes although it was better to do it at this event than the main competition on Sunday!

After this run we went back to our accommodation which was at a holiday park and consisted of lots of small self catering chalets sleeping between 4-8 people which meant the team were scattered around the park. After showering we went for our evening meal which was in a restaurant at the event centre followed by an England team meeting. Later that evening there was a night sprint event around the holiday park and surrounding woods which I couldn't resist and once again managed to make some silly mistakes! At the end of the day my watch told me I had done nearly 22km after walking around Breda, to and from starts/finishes, event centre, and running twice!

On Sunday we woke up bright and early as the first start was at 9.30am with the start being 750m from the event centre which was in turn a 10 minute walk from our chalet. My start time was 10.15 and luckily one of the early starters who had allowed plenty of time to get to the start came back in good time to tell us that the start was actually in the direction of our chalets so was in fact only a 5 minute walk from where we were staying. Also we didn't need to check out of our chalets until later on so we could all have a leisurely preparation for the race and could also come back to shower and change after running.

I knew the course would be runnable and fast so I set off to take the first few controls carefully. They weren't particularly difficult but with a lot of controls in the area and all of them on re-entrants or similar features it was easy to be distracted by other controls. Having taken the first 3 there were then some longer legs but with an option of slogging through rough terrain or running round the paths, mostly, even at my speed, it was quicker to stick to the paths. I took the course carefully and didn't make any particular mistakes although I did stick with safe route choices. This meant that by the time I finished my 6.1km course I had actually run 7.7km so I was pleased with my 51 minutes time and 6th place out of 15 runners overall (2nd English runner and only 30 seconds behind the first placed England W40). The winner was 44 minutes and I know I could not have run that fast.

Overall in the team competition England were narrowly pipped by the Belgian Flanders team coming 2nd overall.
