Results will include your name, club, race time and age group.

Results Data will be also be shared with British Orienteering for the purpose of publishing results and ranking points on the BO website.

Results of past East Pennine Orienteering Club events before GDPR regulations, are retained on the EPOC website.

**Changes to our GDPR Policy:** The club will notify all members of any change to our GDPR Policy via e-mail and the club website.

**Club Officials:** are deemed to have given their permission for their names and photographs to be made publicly available via the club website. The website does not contain any other personal details.

Breach of security: if a breach of your personal data occurs you will be notified immediately.

Children under 16 attending Training Events: e-mail addresses in the case of under 16's are restricted to those supplied by their parents.

Names and ages of children under 16 are held only by agreement with their parents for the purpose of the activity and notification of future Orienteering activities. This information will be immediately deleted on request.

Participants may be asked to give details of current medical conditions where it is relevant to the activity. Any medical data will be deleted after the end of the activity.

# Trying to Finish the Munros at Eighty

With five Munros to do I had long day on the borders of Knoydart one of the most remote parts of Scotland. I reckoned at my age I needed good weather and plenty of daylight hours. So near the end of April I left the A82 tourist trail at the Commando memorial at Spean Bridge in my campervan to head down the single track road to Gairlochy then along the far side of Loch Lochy then inland and along the banks of Loch Arkaig for another 13 miles to a nice parking spot at the head of the loch. Leaving the van at 8.50 (I had intended to leave earlier but the drive up including an O event on High Rigg had been quite tiring) it took me 2 hours to cycle up the rough track up

Glen Dessary until the track became a steep path. Dumped the bike and plodded uphill to reach the first Munro, Sgurr nan Coireachan after 3 hours. Westward along the broad ridge over several tops including Garbh Chioch Beag to my second Munro, Garbh Chioch Mhor. It's now 4pm, the sky cloudless I must continue. At 5.15 I'm on Sgurr na Ciche (the peak of the pap) with wonderful views down Loch Nevis with Rhum and Eigg floating in a silvery sea. Add the Cuillins of Skye and a backward view of a very snowy Ben Nevis to complete the picture. Back down the east ridge quite a bit of soft snow a bit of scrambling down a gully and at 8pm reach my bike. At 9.20 with darkness closing in I'm back at my van. Now two Munros to go.....

# JOK and JK

With several 2017 Spanish training sessions behind me I was reasonably fit by the end of the year though worried about a hernia operation booked for mid January. I was informed it would be 6 weeks recovery so booked another trip to Spain for early March with the aim of starting my training then for the JK. Unfortunately my operation was put back a couple of weeks to the end of the month so I had to alter my plans.

The operation went unbelievably well and I found I was able to be more active than I thought. Within 10 days I had done two moorland 8 mile walks and after the staples were removed I started running again. This enabled the two weeks in Spain to be more intensive and so I found myself able to compete again within 4 weeks of the operation.

The week before the JK I entered the JOK sprint, an event held by Jesus College Oxford every couple of years. The format is a morning timed sprint followed by a chasing start in the afternoon. This time's event was held in Delamere Forest.

The Prologue in Linmere, on a 1:7500 map, was well planned, but with some brambles and brashings sometimes the best route was to run along paths past the control and come in from the other side. I made some early mistakes by looking for controls too early and going direct rather than round but managed to come 12<sup>th</sup> out of 58 on a course including M55s and W40s. I was leading the M65s by 22 seconds.

The chasing start was in Pale Heights in a hilly area with light and dark green woods and a network of tracks. Some of the woods were planted by Deeside in 2000. In the race I managed to hang on to Graham Capper of LOC for much of the race though we were caught by a couple of M55s who had started 30 seconds behind. Fortunately I had got away from the other M65s so I let the M55s battle out the minor placings in their race letting them sprint off. I am pleased to say that the M55 race was won by our own Jonathan Emberton. We both have Flying Pig trophies and I am happy to be the inaugural winner of the M65 class which was included for the first time this year. This was all good training for the JK Sprint the following weekend which is a tale in itself. The moral is not to recce the finish before running. Basically there were two penultimate controls which you could see from the spectator view point and I worked out which was on my course.

Unfortunately my brain got muddled (I am 68!) and coming in with the commentary announcing I was in first place I punched the wrong one. I would have been 2<sup>nd</sup>! By the way the area used was MOD Stafford and was not technical enough for a JK Sprint race.

The two JK areas for the Middle and Long races were ideal terrain for testing Orienteering skills. Brereton is an area full of reentrants and spurs. My course had only 19 controls which I felt was a low number for a Middle distance race. Unfortunately I was put off at the start by not finding the start kite! My control was to the South East and I started navigating before seeing the start which led to some hesitation and a loss of a minute. Another mistake at 5 where I went into the wrong reentrant and a wrong route to 14 added another couple of minute errors but I still managed a creditable 7<sup>th</sup> place.

Beaudesert had more brashings than I remembered in previous events. My best leg was a bit lucky in that I left the previous control in slightly the wrong direction but arrived on a track which I was able to use to successfully find the control. Most people seemed to go straight and got caught up in the brashings. Again I had a good run with Winsplits showing no mistakes though I tired at the end moving from 5<sup>th</sup> to 7<sup>th</sup> in the last ten minutes of the race.

Somehow coming 7<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> in the two races resulted in my coming 3<sup>rd</sup> overall. This was only my second JK podium in all my orienteering days. Unfortunately after my two runs I didn't expect to be on the podium and I was well on my way home by the time of prize giving.

The final thing to mention that I saw my specialist yesterday and he says I can start running again! JK Day 1 Sprint, MOD Stafford - 30 Mar 18



Over the past few years I have managed to come in the top 3 at the British Night, Sprint and Middle Distance Championships on a few occasions, but the British Long Distance, the classic orienteering challenge, has continued to elude me.

The British Champs in 2018 were held at Balmoral so I had debated quite a bit whether it was really worth going such a long way on a normal weekend, not a bank holiday and not connected to school holidays, however earlier in the year David found a reasonably priced and timed flight from Manchester to Aberdeen on Friday night and then a return flight on Saturday night. I must have mentioned something in passing to mum who was suddenly also keen to go, so one winter day I found myself booking flights for Mum, Laura and I, car hire, Premier Inn for a night and entries to the event.

After an interesting journey on Friday, courtesy of delayed trains over the Pennines but followed by an efficient and timely flight, Saturday morning dawned sunny and warm. We arrived at Balmoral to be parked on freshly mown grass in better condition than our garden right next to assembly/finish and with views of Balmoral Castle and along the Dee valley with snow-capped mountains visible in the distance. A truly stunning setting and finished off perfectly by the weather.

I had looked at a previous map of the area but had never run there before. The map reminded me of day one of the Scottish 6 days in 2017, the day that I monumentally messed up my course, so I knew I couldn't afford such errors this time. Number one was very close to the start which I don't really like as I didn't have any feel for the map or terrain. I took it carefully and hit it spot on, noticing that key features were guite obvious. I was then steady and mostly clean to 2 and 3 but found the terrain difficult to really get running on. Four, 5 and 6 were tricky with few features and plenty of opportunity to really mess up. I had minor wobbles at all 3 but was relieved not to lose too much time, especially as I also always feel I am being overly hesitant with decisions on such terrain. A couple of longer legs to 7 and 8 which were physically demanding given the terrain, climb and heat. Eight through to 16 were control picking so I knew I had to be careful. I came out of number 9 at a 90 degree error but making everything fit. Luckily I took a bearing and wondered what an earth my compass was doing until I realised there was nothing wrong with the compass but was more a case of user error! Phew, that could have been a really costly mistake. I managed to keep my head mostly in order through to the end of the course but I was exhausted. I was relieved to have had a mostly clean run with no significant errors and as far as I could tell I had taken reasonable route choices as well. As I passed the finish I heard my name being announced in first place on W45L. I knew there were a couple of people starting after me who could beat me so I was pleased at the end of the event when I came 2<sup>nd</sup> overall and 2 minutes behind the winner. My first British Long Distance Championships medal, but unfortunately I was unable to be at the prize giving as they didn't hold it until Sunday, after the relays, by which time I was long back in Wakefield.


