East Pennine Orienteering Club Summary of Committee Meeting Wednesday 14 November 2018 at 7.30pm Marsh Liberal Club



- 1. **Present:** Rod Shaw, Emma Harrison, Jackie Page, Neil Croasdell, David Morgan (Treasurer), Jean Lochhead (Chair)
- 2. Apologies: None
- 3. **Minutes of last meeting** approved and proposed to be a true record: Jean Lochhead, Seconded, Emma Harrison.
- 4. **Matters arising from the last minutes:** The minutes were read through in detail and the committee updated as to progress on the issues mentioned some of which were discussed later in the meeting.
- 5. Chairman's Report: Jean reported the success of the Club in the Compass Sport Trophy Final held at Cannock Chase in which we finished 2nd. Jean also reported the participation of 4 members of the club, 1 for England and 3 for Wales in the Veterans Home International held in South Wales on the 29/30 September. Emma, James Williams and Phil Scarf all ran well with Emma winning W45. Jean mopped up the points for the last finisher whilst running in W60 but had a happier time in the Relay.
- 6. **Treasurers Report:** had been circulated before the meeting and is at the end of these minutes.
- 7. Compass Sport Trophy: Rod Shaw has been part of the debate on revising the courses for older age groups so that they can play more of a part in the scoring process. The statistics that Rod had produced to submit to the CSC/T committee appeared in the last Epistle but to date no decision has been made. The qualifying heat for next years CST will be on 17 March 2019 and Rod has applied for EPOC to be included in the Sherwood Pines event. The committee agreed to subsidise the entry fees for all participants in both the Heat & Final! All members are welcome to enter.
- 8. **Fixtures 2019 and beyond:** The committee discussed the spreadsheet of events, attached below. Regions are now allocating UKUL's and in spite of our excellent events and Urban areas, due to the YHOA Rota, we are not down to have another UKUL until 2021!
- BOC Relay 6th May 2019: EPOC is to supply the helpers for this event and more information will be available after the BOC Organising Committee meeting on 6 January 2019.
- 10. **Control putting OUT/IN:** Concern has been expressed about the amount of time and effort that has to be expended by Planners in putting out controls on the morning of an event. Urban events are not so much of a problem as most courses are accessible by car. Woodland/Moorland areas that require carrying of equipment to the control sites are to be assigned to a team. It was decided that at future events we ask Planners to mark the "All

Controls" map dividing the wood/moor into manageable chunks. This map would show controls and their numbers and between a team make putting out controls much quicker. Those putting out controls would have to be non-runners or declare themselves non-competitive. The same partitioned map could be used for the collection team after the event. To make it more accurate for those putting controls OUT, control sites should be taped and numbered. Control collectors are to remove the tapes when they collect the controls. Organisers should make sure that as well as arranging teams for Registration, Start etc. they have arranged teams for this task and not leave it to goodwill on the day.

11. POC Report: Thornes Park is currently being remapped but is big enough for a Sprint Event as well as a POC. There are 4 more areas, which already have either OCAD or WYODA maps, which will be refurbed.

12. We still do not have a Secretary. It was decided that Minutes could be done by the current committee members in rotation, which means, once a year. It is still not ideal, as someone has to prepare the Agenda and Notice of Meetings. A willing volunteer would be nice.

- 14. Date of Next Meeting: Wednesday 16 January 2019 at 7.30pm. Same venue.

Summary of Treasurer's Report for November 2018

- 1 Since the end of the financial year the club has not held any events. The Marsden Moor event scheduled for September was cancelled during the drought due to the high fire risk. The decision was taken reluctantly but delaying any decision would have risked significant expenditure hiring buses etc.
- Expenditure since the AGM has been quite high. The invoice for the Oakwell Hall event centre was eventually received from Kirklees. An amount to cover this was included as a provision in last year's accounts. The mapping bill for Crow Nest Park also just missed the end of year deadline. Another major item of expenditure was the net subsidy to the CompassSport Trophy team who did the club proud again. We should also note the cost of the Dreamweaver software that David Harrison needs as he begins to take over from Anthony as Club Webmaster. There is a monthly fee for this software (directly paid by David) and to minimise the number of individual transactions I have made an upfront payment for the first 6 months. BOF affiliation has increased this year to £60 and has been paid.
- 3 Income has been minimal. Apart from the contribution to the CST entry fees, the final 2 membership fees have been received from BOF. In addition we have received £40 from Ramblers Walking Holidays as part of their Walking Partnership agreement.
- 4 Following the successful mapping of Crow Nest Park, the club has let a further contract for the mapping of Thornes Park, Wakefield.

As of today the bank account stands with a reduction of approximately £1000 since the year end.

Minutes of AGM held on 27th September 2018

- 1) Apologies: Pete Harris (HALO), Natasha Conway (AIRE), Tim Evans (CLARO), Jean Lochhead (EPOC)
- 2) Minutes of the AGM held on 21st September 2017: Approved.
- 3) Matters arising not elsewhere on the agenda: None
- 4) Officers' Annual Reports
 - (a) Chairman: Good regional representation at the JHIs was noted. It is good to see that volunteers to organise events have been forthcoming during the year. The hard work of all volunteers who act as event officials in the region is much appreciated. The operation of BO committees has seen some development since the arrival of our new Chief Executive, Peter Hart.
 - (b) Secretary: In addition to the chairman's comments, there has also been good representation at Senior International level from athletes moving into the region and graduating from the junior ranks
 - (c) Treasurer: Referred to documents circulated in advance of the meeting.
 - (d) Fixtures Secretary: Noted that YHOA plays a full part in contributing to the National Fixtures programme, possibly more than our fair share. Cross country O events this autumn in the region are sparse. There are reasons for this, but it is still disappointing.
 - (e) Junior Squad Co-ordinator: A Full written report had been circulated prior to the meeting. It was agreed that the Junior Co-ordinator, Natasha Conway should be commended for her work.

5) Club Representatives Annual Reports:

SYO – The club continues to have thriving Junior participation, some from non-orienteering backgrounds. Other achievements include reaching the final of the CompassSport Cup and hosting the Peter Palmer Relays where an SYO junior team won the Joan George Trophy. The club also successfully trialled MapRun events using smartphones.

EPOC – Dave expressed the club's disappointment to have to cancel the Marsden Moor event early due to fire risk. It is hoped to stage the event next year. The club AGM had been held on 26th September and a full committee elected with the exception of a secretary. EPOC are again CompassSport Trophy finalists

CLARO – No report

AIRE – The club has continued to develop under the chairmanship of Tony Thornley who is coming to the end of his 3 year term. AIRE has again staged approximately 50 events over the year. Midweek level D events have attracted new young adults to join. Membership is up – currently 224. The club employs a Junior Development Officer, Simon Martland who has successfully delivered orienteering experiences in schools, but this has not yet resulted in much junior participation at our weekend events.

HALO - Geographical spread and the Humber are barriers to participation. The club promotes schools activities that feed into the Humber Schools Games. This raises the profile of the club but has not translated into junior membership. HALO events are generally of a high quality. The Lincolnshire Poacher series tends to boost membership but not retain those new members.

EBOR – Nev reported a poor turnout at the Brayton Barff Yorkshire Night League event, but in contrast the Northern Championships weekend and White Rose Weekend, both staged by the club were very successful. The White Rose was enhanced by access to Helmsley Castle granted by English Heritage. The club was able to avoid paying land use fees twice where both a land owner and Forest Enterprise are involved. This information may be of use to other clubs. Nev is completing his 3rd year as Club Chair

6) Accounts 2017/18

The Accounts as circulated before the meeting were presented by John Butler (YHOA Treasurer). The accounts have again been independently examined by Kate Brown and were approved by the committee, proposed by Tony Thornley and seconded by Mike Cope. It was agreed that the YHOA Constitution should be amended to refer to independent examination of the accounts rather than independent audit under paragraph 7 (a) of the Constitution, to adhere to currently recognised financial terminology.

7) Budget and Club Fees 2018/19

The committee approved the Budget for 2018/19 presented by the Treasurer. This was proposed by Ian Marshall and seconded by Paul Bradbury. John advised that the Club fees should remain at £4 per senior member at 01/04/2019. This was agreed.

Nev again thanked John for his efficient work in presenting the Accounts and Budget this year **British Orienteering Championships**
