






## **Euro City Race – Porto**

So, last race of the tour last year and first race this, I write after my second overseas weekend of orienteering. Again with Goodair tours, this time 5 of us, our tour leaders, Judith and Guy, and my fellow travellers, Gerry and Neil. After riding on a very packed train to Manchester Airport - so many people seem to travel on a weekday before 8am, thank goodness I've retired - we all met at terminal 3, endured Ryanair self-service check in (well some of us did) and then, c/o Costa, had the necessary sustenance before the flight. Apart from a bit of turbulence we had a safe landing and it was a good flight. A train ride and walk saw us at our accommodation - I can certainly recommend Spot Family Apartments, we were all very happy with our spacious and well furbished apartments. Arriving Thursday enabled us to get our bearings on Friday and we used last year's map to see part of this scenic city (and some areas in need of repair). Just a 15 minute walk from our accommodation to registration - I must be honest, I'd hoped for a t-shirt along with my race number as people have had before, but this year just numbers (and no other orientation information, so thankfully we are orienteers, or meant to be), however at €5 entry a day, I shouldn't complain.

Well, Friday's event, a night event. Now for those off early, there wasn't much night as such, however for some of us whose start was at dusk, I can tell you night falls quickly in Porto and

controls on trestle tables in an unlit park are not easy to find, well not for this night event newby. So ..... well no, I did keep going, learnt to manage compass, map, torch, route choices, traverse street areas (preferred these), visited another unlit park where I stuck to the wall as I could see so little, cars on tram lines, past the place on the pre-race literature thankfully Neil has spotted ...... and eventually finished successfully. Was I glad to see Gerry and Neil by the finish. My brother asked if I had enjoyed it; after my not very positive response he reckoned I might feel differently in the morning? I did. They took out that leg in the second unlit park! The security guard had initially ensured some could only enter via the long way round which was lit - my route choice wasn't - I guess it was fair?

An after 10pm finish Friday for me to a 10am first start for some on Saturday meant we hadn't much downtime, especially as we needed to get the bus this time. So 8.15am meet up it was, met fellow orienteers at the bus stop and on the bus to find, to our delight, the bus stop was a 2 minute walk to the event centre and start! So time to find a cafe - Google maps was very useful - as some of us had time for the luxury of a coffee and change from €2 for the round. It's hilly in Porto, and Saturday's race was no exception. Around the wooded area (I dislike woods so not the best of starts) and crags in the park, I eventually located my 1-8 controls and onto cement block housing areas - checking the building shapes, counting the blocks, climbing the hills and seeing controls at tops of stairs - I was very pleased no SIAC enabling as it was not easy to get to some controls (number 42 for example) - and little narrow roads this time. However, all round successfully, some of us getting very good value for their entry fee (me - 1.9k, no way!). Judith and Guy got their prizes for their podium finishes both days and met us back at our lunch stop for map and route choice discussion. We watched the FA cup final Saturday evening in a local cafe - most of it on their tv, but with it being the last day of the Portuguese season starting 15 minutes before the end of 'our' match, they switched the channel; we watched the end of the final on a Smart phone we're resourceful us tourists


Sunday, the main event, longer, hillier and a hotter day for us weary competitors, but off we set at 8.15am, on the underground this time - again we joined the tram nearby. We got to grips with aetting tickets, saw a lot of female runners dressed in pink t-shirts travelling somewhere nearby (we think a Race for Life type event) on the underground. Now travel instructions from the event organisers weren't their strong point, so we walked the scenic route to the event centre; a beautiful setting, thankfully a sunny day, but sadly, though some of us were off over an hour and a half after the early starters in our party, nowhere to relax with a coffee fix it seemed. However, the resourceful duo (off the latest) had a wander, somehow found where the volunteers were to have refreshments and acquired very welcome Turkish coffees (a first for us both). Judith and Guy were off just after 10, me at 11.42! So after much chatting with some friendly fellow orienteers it was finally 4 minute call up. Punching start again, as had been the other days - start flag this time up 2 flights of stone steps. Up was to be the order of the day, control 1 in the gardens, 2 up the top of more steps, I seemed to run down alleys at the back of people's houses (yes I was right) and yes, one control seemed to be in someone's back garden where the residents were having their morning drinks! I did okish finding my first 8 controls, but the next 8 took me rather longer, especially number 13 at the back of the apartment block that you couldn't get to the way I wanted: no wonder the map contours were so close here. A Portuguese resident tried to help, but though I guessed she was saying 'it's up there, you have to go round' it took me some time to grasp it! Eventually I got to control 16 (of 20) and was surprised to realise I was almost back. Nearly 90 minutes, but no mis-punch and not quite last. 3 events, 3 days, a new city, lovely weather, good company. Judith and Guy podiumed again and over the 3 events added to our return luggage: bottles of port and tins of tuna within hold luggage, olive oil, medals and soap but sadly not olive tapenade (confiscated) within hand luggage.

Did I enjoy it? – yes - would I go again? – yes please – and a night event? – yes, but I'll add a head torch to all the other orienteering gear I seem to be acquiring!


And the reasons for the areas and costs? It transpires, though not advertised, the theme this year was social inclusion. Consequently, areas of the city with the most social and economic






